

- I first discovered NDTI in the summer of 2022.
- My neighbour suggested that I try it as a way of getting back on my feet.
- I had a bright future but then I had it put on hold due to COVID-19. I went out very little
- It took me way longer than expected to get back on track.
- ➤ I had 1:1 sessions
- ➤ I joined the peer support group in September
- \succ I joined the training squad in October
- ➤ I joined the creativity group in 2023
- ➤ I went on three residential trips: Leeds, Away Days, Wokingham (with Legoland) and London.







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The Creativity Group

- A group I was part of was the creativity group.
- These were online sessions that lasted for 6 weeks discussing about anything creative or arty.
- The topics could range from 2D and 3D art to digital art or handwritten art.
- In a few of the sessions, we as young people also got the opportunity to share our own cool art we made. I remember a few in particular that caught my eye but I did not share very much myself.
- It was a shame these sessions ended so soon but luckily, there was another set of online sessions based on sharing art with a different name. I will talk about it now.







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The Time to Express Group

- Similar to the creativity group, I took part in Time to Express. This
 was the most recent so far
- These consisted of another 6 online sessions where
- We got to talk about how we express ourselves using art and creativity to do it
- There were even some Human Rights elements involved which would then link to the London residential
- What I liked about this group was how much we all had a say in how we all express ourselves in our views and opinions on things without it ever getting too much for young people.
- It also showed how good art is to help people to express themselves.

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NDTi organised a meet up for young people in London.







COSSACKS 1910-11




The 'cossacks' of the title are Russian cavalrymen which you can just recognise from their orange hats at the top and right of the painting. However Wassily Kandinsky believed paintings did not need to represent the real world. He felt that emotions could be expressed through the way colours and lines were arranged in a painting. He linked musical tones to particular colours, and considered colour to have a powerful spiritual impact. Can you hear music when you look at the painting?
